2nd VP —MEMBERSHIP LT Dick Cook USN (RET)



The regular session of the Texas Legislature will wrap up its regular session on May 27. Our lawmakers have their backs against the wall as they bump up against mandatory deadlines. Speaking of Veteran-related bills, the MOAA Texas Council of Chapters spent a couple of days at the Capitol in late March pressing legislators on high priority legislation. Here are the bills we pushed and their current status:

HB 716: Relating to the exemption from ad valorem taxation of part of the appraised value of the residence homestead of a severely disabled veteran or the surviving spouse of a severely disabled veteran based on the disability rating of the veteran. **Left pending in committee and unlikely to pass this session -**

SB 1180: Relating to certain procedures applicable to veterans who participate in Veterans treatment court programs and to a court cost imposed on conviction to benefit those programs; changing a fee. **Passed by the full Senate and House Committee, awaiting a full House vote and likely to be passed and signed by the Governor -** <https://capitol.texas.gov/BillLookup/History.aspx?LegSess=86R&Bill=SB1180>

SB 196: Relating to an exemption from ad valorem taxation of the residence homestead of the surviving spouse of a member of the armed services of the United States who is killed or fatally injured in the line of duty. **Passed by the full Senate and House Committee, awaiting a full House vote and likely to be passed and signed by the Governor -**

HB 3412: Relating to the creation of the Texas Veterans County Service Officer Task Force. **Passed by House Committee, awaiting House vote, as likely to be passed as not -**

SB 283: Relating to the applicability of the law governing the provision of state aid to certain local governments disproportionately affected by the granting of ad valorem tax relief to disabled veterans. **Identical to HB 634, this legislation is going nowhere in the Senate and moving at a snail's pace through the house -**

Doug got a well-deserved hero's welcome from Senator Jane Nelson and was recognized by the Senate's Chair on Veteran Affairs & Border Security, Senator Donna Campbell at the scheduled committee meeting.

Stay Involved Stay Young

Earlier this month, I and your other MOAA Board members had an opportunity to review the Chapter's 5 Star Award submission before sending it off to meet the May 1st deadline. I was struck at how involved our Chapter members are and how many important and impactful efforts you engage in. It is heartwarming to see so many "Continue to Serve"!

Speaking of impactful efforts, the Board was recently notified that we will receive a \$2500 grant from the MOAA Community Foundation. Our project, which survived a competitive selection process, will provide Military Sexual Trauma survivors with free professional therapy groups at the Chris Kyle Veterans Center in southern Denton County. The groups, called "Women of Courage" will follow a VA approved protocol that has been modified by MVPN Counselor, Debra Rogers to include expressive art therapy. Recruitment for the groups begins in June and we expect to kick off sessions in the early Fall 2019.

So why is this important? DoD estimates that approximately 18,900 service members were victims of sexual assault in 2014. The exact prevalence of military sexual trauma (MST) is unknown. However, a recent analysis revealed that 15.7% of military personnel and veterans report MST (3.9% of men, 38.4% of women) when the measure includes **both harassment of a sexual nature and sexual assault** (which is the military and VA definition of MST). **Additionally, 13.9% report MST (1.9% of men, 23.6% of women) when the measure assesses only sexual assault.** Regardless of the type of incident (i.e., harassment or assault), women have significantly larger prevalence rates compared to men. MST remains a pervasive problem, among both men and women in the military, and is a significant cause of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder.

We are hopeful that these groups will begin the recovery process for local Women Veterans who suffer from the notable effects of MST, like homelessness, major depression and suicide ideation.


The Military Veteran Peer Network and various community partners will hold a Suicide and PTSD Awareness and Training event in Lewisville. This event meaningfully supports TEXAS HCR 1481 - Designating June as Veteran Suicide and PTSD Awareness Month for a 10-year period beginning in 2019. As stated in the continuing resolution, "The aftermath of trauma can manifest itself as depression, outbursts of anger, and substance abuse, but the most tragic consequence is suicide; from 2008 to 2016, more than 6,000 veterans each year took their own lives; moreover, in 2016, the suicide rate for veterans was 26.1 per 100,000 as opposed to 17.4 for non-veteran adults, when adjusted for age and gender; and WHEREAS, Suicide and other consequences of PTSD affect not only the veterans themselves, but also their families, friends, and communities;..." VA MISSION Act

Key Elements



What is the MISSION Act?

The MISSION Act puts Veterans at the center of care to coordinate their care whether it's at a VA facility or in partnership through a community provider.

The VA MISSION Act:

1. Improves community care
2. Expands eligibility for Caregiver Support
3. Enhances VA's ability to recruit and retain top notch employees
4. Strengthens VA's building infrastructure

VA's High Quality of Care:

- A 2018 RAND study found VA health care performed similarly or better than the private sector. The study was issued by an American nonprofit organization that analyzes national inpatient and outpatient quality of care measures.
- A 2019 Dartmouth College study found the Veterans Health Administration (VHA) may provide better care than the private sector in every local area. It also found VA health care was significantly better than non-VA care in 14 out of 15 quality and patient safety indicators.



Key Elements

Access to Care – VA offers same day services for Mental Health and Primary Care at all sites across the country.

Improves Community Care – The MISSION Act streamlines VA community care programs making it easier to navigate, for Veterans, their families, community providers, and VA employees.

Expand Eligibility for Caregiver Support - The MISSION Act expands eligibility for VA's Caregiver program. It will now include eligible Veterans from all eras of service. The expansion will occur in two phases. The first starts with those who were injured on or before May 7, 1975. Further expansion will occur two years later. The expansion timeline is still under development.

Strengthen VA's Infrastructure - The Asset and Infrastructure Review (AIR) process in the MISSION Act will provide VA the necessary flexibility to improve older buildings, bringing them in line with modern standards to help us support news and high tech equipment.

Strengthen VA's Ability to Recruit and Retain - VA is focused on recruiting top notch health care experts to ensure Veterans are receiving the care they have earned. This Act will allow for a new scholarship program, greater access to VA's education debt-reduction program and improved flexibility for providing bonuses for recruitment, relocation and retention.

Surviving Spouse Services News You Can Use

The April Surviving Spouse Virtual Chapter telephone conference was focused on pre-planning for what you need to know when losing a spouse. A whole library of online and hard copy publications is available to MOAA paid memberships

such as: "Help Your Survivors Now" and "Personal Affairs Guide Workbook". Retired AF LtCol (Ret) Shane Ostrom, MOAA's Finance and Benefits Adviser and Certified Financial Planner, is available to provide his expertise on the subject. Shane can be reached by email at shaneo@moaa.org or by phone at 703.838.8128.

Although MOAA can assist with planning, the real answer is that each of us must make sure that we are prepared. People should seriously consider when contemplating investments: who is ultimately going to take it over? When preparing either for a survivor or for retirement, make sure that the people you are dealing with are ones that you can trust. There are many advisors who are just after a quick buck, and they are often trained in motivation techniques. Shane recommends keeping things simple. As he said, simplicity in the financial world is good; it doesn't have to be "cosmic". Funeral Directors can often be of great assistance. There are also incidences of credit cards, accounts or insurance policies that spouses do not know about but come to light after a death. Education of spouses is paramount. Spouses cannot assume that everything will be taken care of. Today it is important that spouses are computer literate, that they know how and where to access information and that they know what user names and passwords are. It is especially important that a spouse know whether he/she is a co-owner of a credit card or just a signatory. If only a signatory, the credit card is cancelled upon the death of the owner, and it may be difficult to obtain a credit card in one's own name.

On another note....Anne Hartline (AL) reported that MOAA sponsored training workshops for councils and chapters now include a session for Surviving Spouse Liaisons. The next workshop in our area is 15-16 November in Austin, TX. Spouses who attend the workshops are encouraged to also join the session.
